

2025 OCAC Global Mandarin Speaking Competition

Notification of Personal Data Collection, Processing, and Use

I. This notification is issued in compliance with Article 8 of the Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA) of the Republic of China (Taiwan).

II. **Organization:** The Overseas Community Affairs Council (OCAC) has delegated the handling of personal information to its Overseas Culture Center of Taipei Economic and Cultural Office, overseas secretaries, overseas missions, and the outsourced supplier.

III. **Purpose of collection:** The personal data of participants will be collected, processed, and used for the registration, administration, and follow-up communication related to "2025 OCAC Global Mandarin Speaking Competition" (hereinafter referred to as "the competition"). All data processing will comply with the PDPA and related regulations.

IV. **Categories of personal data:** The personal data collected includes, but is not limited to, the participant's Huayuworld.org account and password(C001), country of residence(C011), the name of the compatriot school or the Taiwan Center for Mandarin Learning attended(C051), as well as the participants' name(C001), date of birth(C011), and email address(C001).

V. **Personal Data Processing and Use:**

i. **Data Usage Period:** The personal data will be used from the moment of registration for the competition until the purpose of data collection fulfilled.

ii. **Data Usage Areas:** The personal data will be used within Taiwan (the territory of the Republic of China), the participant's country of residence, and other areas authorized by the participant for processing and use.

iii. Recipients of Personal Data: The OCAC, its Overseas Culture Center of Taipei Economic and Cultural Office, overseas secretaries or overseas missions, and the outsourced supplier authorized by the OCAC.

iv. Methods of Data Use: The collected data will be used for registration, recording competition results, communication with participants, statistical analysis, and subsequent follow-up activities.

VI. In accordance with the PDPA, participants have the rights to request, in writing, the following regarding their personal data:

1. Inquiry or access to the data.
2. A copy of the data.
3. Supplementation or correction of the data.
4. Suspension of data collection, processing, or use.
5. Deletion of the data.

VII. If the participant fails to provide correct and complete personal information required by the competition, they must provide legitimate explanation for the omission. Failure to do so will result in the inability to complete the registration process and forfeiture of the right to participate in the competition.
